Letter from Marina Ilari, Administrator of the ATA TCD

I would like to share with you some of the highlights of our activities this past year, and talk about the exciting plans which Alaina and I have in store for 2019!

In April of 2018, the TCD sent out a survey to collect feedback from its members.
